manna while they journeyed through the wilderness! The Scriptures say, 'Moses gave them bread from heaven to eat.'"



³ The Israelites said to them, "If only we had died by the Lord's hand in Egypt!


There we sat around pots of meat and ate all the food we wanted, but you have brought us out into this desert to starve this entire assembly to death."

be for just a day or two, or for five or ten or even twenty. 20 You will eat it for a whole month until you gag and are sick of it. For you have rejected the Lord, who is here among you, and you have whined to him, saying, 'Why did we ever leave Egypt?"

Numbers 11:31-34 NLT

31 Now the Lord sent a wind that brought quail from the sea and let them fall all around the camp. For miles in every direction there were quail flying about three feet above the ground. ³² So the people went out and caught quail all that day and throughout the night and all the next day, too. No one gathered less than

fifty bushels! They spread the quail all around the camp to dry. 33 But while they were gorging themselves on the meat—while it was still in their mouths—the anger of the Lord blazed against the people, and he struck them with a severe plague. 34 So that place was called Kibrothhattaavah (which means "graves of gluttony") because there they buried the people who had craved meat from Egypt.

When we try to find <u>life</u> from anything other than the Bread of Life it will ultimately lead to disappointment, disaster and <u>death</u>.
