

# GALATIANS 5:22-23A NLT



<sup>22</sup>But the Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, <sup>23</sup>gentleness, and self-control.









The word patience in the Greek is the word macrothumia. It is defined as enduring suffering, forgiving others and being slow to anger.



If we have the fruit of patience in our lives it means we <u>endure</u> all situations with a posture of <u>forgiveness</u> and grace towards others, being slow to <u>anger</u> towards others.

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God is this kind of <u>patient</u>.

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
It is how God <u>interacts</u> with us.

<sup>17</sup>They refused to obey and did not remember the miracles you had done for them. Instead, they became stubborn and appointed a leader to take them back to their slavery in Egypt. ## 1 PETER 2:19-25 NLT

<sup>19</sup>For God is pleased when, conscious of his will, you patiently endure unjust treatment. <sup>20</sup>Of course, you get no credit for being patient if you are beaten for doing wrong. But if you suffer for doing good and endure it patiently, God is pleased with you.

<sup>21</sup>For God called you to do good, even if it means suffering, just as Christ suffered for you. He is your example, and you must follow in his steps.


It means that we are <u>slow</u>.
